THAT Welland City Council directs that prior to the lifting of the Holding Symbol (H), the Owner inform the City in writing that the following items have been completed: the filing of a Record of Site Condition (RSC); the entire sanitary sewer system has been completed and tested and sanitary services have been installed to the front property line and that a video and written report of an internal examination of the sanitary and storm sewer systems is provided; that the entire water system has been completed and tested and disinfected and water services have been installed to the front property line; that the entire storm sewer system has been completed; that the asphalt roadway has been constructed (the stone base and asphalt base); that the grading requirements and lot grading requirements have been met; all streetlights are in good working order and energized by the Welland Hydro-Electric Corp; all street name and traffic control signs are installed all to the satisfaction of the City Engineer; that Model Homes may be permitted as contemplated by the Subdivider's Agreement while the Holding Symbol (H) is in place; and further

THAT Welland City Council grants Draft Approval to the Vanier Estates Subdivision (File: 26T-14-15002) developed by 544063 Ontario Inc., being Part Township Lot 258, former Township of Thorold, being Parts 1 and 2 on Plan 59R-15305, municipally known as 381 Clare Avenue, in the City of Welland based upon a Draft Plan prepared by Suda & Maleszyk Surveying Inc. dated July 20, 2015 consisting of seventy-eight (78) lots for single-detached dwellings, two (2) Blocks for multiple-residential use and one (1) Block for environmental protection, subject to the following Conditions:

- 1. That the Owner enters into a Subdivider's Agreement with the City of Welland to be registered on Title.
- 2. That no grading or construction work shall commence on site until such time as the Subdivider's Agreement has been entered into, all financial security is in place and the Plan and all documentation has been registered on Title.
- 3. That all development must conform to the City of Welland Municipal Standards, as amended.
- 4. That all necessary Easements required for utility and servicing purposes be granted to the appropriate Authority free of all encumbrances.
- 5. The Owner shall pay to the City of Welland, upon execution of the Subdivider's Agreement, \$300.00 per dwelling unit for the installation of trees within the road allowance by City forces.
- 6. That the Owner agrees to convey to the City of Welland Block 81 for environmental protection purposes.
- 7. That the Owner agrees to pay 5% Cash-in-Lieu of Parkland in accordance with By-law 2014-01. The Developer shall establish the value of land for each lot, to the satisfaction of the City, prior to execution of the Subdivision Agreement. The values shall be determined by an Appraiser in accordance with City Policy as of the day before the day the first building permit is issued for the development. The values shall be referenced in the Special Conditions and Building Restrictions of the Subdivision Agreement.

- 8. The Owner shall provide a Geotechnical Subsurface Investigation Study prepared by a qualified Geotechnical firm, to the City which must make recommendations on the use of the site for the construction of dwellings/buildings.
- 9. That the Owner is required to file a Record of Site Condition (RSC) for this development on the Ministry of the Environment's Brownfields Environmental Site Registry in accordance with Ontario Regulation 153/04, as amended by Ontario Regulation 511/09, and that the Owner provide a copy of the Ministry of the Environment's written acknowledgement of the filing of the RSC to the Regional Development Services Division.
- 10. That the Subdivision Agreement between the Owner and the City of Welland contain the following clause:

"Should deeply buried archaeological remains/resources be found on the property during construction activities, the Heritage Operations Unit of the Ontario Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (London: 519-675-7742) and Mayer Heritage Consultants Inc. shall be notified immediately. In the event that human remains are encountered during construction, the Owner should immediately notify the police or coroner, the Registrar of Cemeteries of the Ministry of Small Business and Consumer Services (Toronto: 416-326-8392), the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport and Mayer Heritage Consultants Inc."

- 11. That the Owner submit a written undertaking to the Niagara Region (Development Services Division) that draft approval of this subdivision does not include a commitment of servicing allocation by the Regional Municipality of Niagara as this servicing allocation will be assigned at the time of registration and any pre-screening will be at the sole risk and responsibility of the Owner.
- 12. That the Owner submit a written undertaking to the Niagara Region (Development Services Division) that all offers and agreements of Purchase and Sale, which may be negotiated prior to registration of this subdivision, shall contain a clause indicating that a servicing allocation for this subdivision will not be assigned until the Plan is registered and a similar clause be inserted in the Subdivision Agreement between the Owner and the City of Welland.
- 13.That prior to approval of the final Plan or any on-site grading, the Owners submit to the City of Welland, the Niagara Region (Development Services Division) and Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority for review and approval two copies of a detailed stormwater management plan for the subdivision and the following plans designed and sealed by a suitably qualified Professional Engineer in accordance with the Ministry of the Environment documents entitled Stormwater Management Planning and Design Manual, March 2003 and Stormwater Quality Guidelines for New Development, June 1991 and confirming the following:
 - a. Detailed lot grading, servicing and drainage plans, noting both existing and proposed grades and the means whereby overland flows will be accommodated across the site.
- 14. That the Subdivision Agreement between the Owner and the City of Welland contain provisions whereby the Owner agrees to implement the approved stormwater management, erosion and sedimentation control measures required in accordance with Condition 13.
- 15. That prior to final approval for registration of this Plan, the Owner shall submit the design drawings (with calculations) for the sanitary and storm drainage systems required to service this development and obtain Environmental Compliance Approval from the Ministry of the Environment under the Transfer of Review Program to the satisfaction of the Niagara Region (Development Services Division).
 - NOTE: Under the Ministry of Environment Transfer of Review Program, general sanitary and storm systems are reviewed. Any specialized systems and/or stormwater management will require direct application to the MOE office in Toronto. Please note that any additional approvals required from any other agency (NPCA, MTO, etc.) as part of the application must be obtained prior to submission of the ECA Application. The Developer should discuss any items with an Engineering Consultant.
- 16. That the Owner ensures that all streets and development Blocks can provide an access in accordance with the Regional Municipality of Niagara Policy C3.C17, Collection of Material By Way of Entry on Private Property and by-laws relating to curbside collection of waste throughout all phases of development. If developed in phases, where a through street is not maintained, the Owner shall provide a revised Draft Plan to reflect a proposed temporary turnaround/cul-de-sac with a minimum curb radius of 12.8 metres.

- 17. That the Draft Plan design be revised for the rear of the lots backing onto Draper's Creek, or alternatively an Environmental Impact Study be submitted in order to justify the setback/buffer reduction for these lots to the satisfaction of the Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority.
 - That the Owner's Engineer provide calculations to the City of Welland which show that there is adequate downstream capacity on Clare Avenue to accept the new proposed development sanitary flow.
- 18. That the Owner's Engineer provide confirmation/calculations to the City of Welland which show that there is adequate water pressure and fire flow capacities for the new development when it is connected to the existing watermain on Clare Avenue.
- 19. That the Owner's Engineer provide information to the City of Welland with regards to where the oil/grit separator will be located within the development and confirm with applicable agencies that quantity control is not required on this stormwater system.
- 20. That the Owner is responsible for the urbanization of Clare Avenue along the Clare Avenue frontage of the subject lands to the centre line of Clare Avenue which would include road resurfacing with hot mix asphalt, elimination of roadside ditches, installation of curbs and gutters, 1.5m wide sidewalks, and restoration of any road surfaces damaged as a result of construction.
- 21. The Owner covenants and agrees to provide the City of Welland with evidence that satisfactory arrangements, financial and otherwise, have been made with Canada Post Corporation for the installation of Community Mail Boxes (CMB's) as required by Canada Post Corporation and as shown on the approved engineering design drawings/draft plan, at the time of sidewalk and/or curb installation. The Owner further covenants and agrees to provide notice to prospective purchasers of the locations of CMB's and that home/business mail delivery will be provided via CMB, provided the Developer has paid for the activation and equipment installation of the CMB's.
- 22. That prior to the granting of Approval for the Final Plan, the City of Welland, will require written notice from the following upon their respective Conditions having been met satisfactorily:

Regional Niagara for Conditions: 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 15, 16, 17; Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority for Conditions: 13, 17; Canada Post for Condition: 22

23. That if Final Approval is not given to this Plan within three (3) years of the approval date and no extensions have been given, Draft Approval shall lapse. If the Owner wishes to request an extension to Draft Approval, a written request, with reasons why the extension is required must be received by the City prior to the lapsing date; and further

THAT Welland City Council authorizes the Mayor to sign the Draft Approval and Final Approval Plans for the Vanier Estates Subdivision once all Conditions have been satisfied.
