RECOMMENDATION:

THAT THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WELLAND grants the Niagara Regional Exhibition (NRE) funding in the amount of \$24,641.00, being the unspent funding in the City's 2016 Operating Budget previously allocated to the Niagara Food Festival in order to facilitate an event which combines the NRE with a Food Festival to take place on September 16-17-18, 2016; and further

That Council authorize the CFO to transfer the approved budget amount of \$24,641.00 from the Niagara Food Festival budget to the Niagara Regional Exhibition.

ORIGIN AND BACKGROUND:

In early July, the NRE Board decided to cancel this year's exhibition, regroup and prepare for 2017.

On August 3, 2016, the Mayor's Office received a letter from the Treasurer of the Niagara Regional Exhibition on behalf of their Board Members. In their letter, they indicated that they were revisiting their decision and, upon approval for funding from the City of Welland, they are prepared to organize and host the annual Niagara Regional Exhibition which has been held in Welland for 163 years. The NRE are requesting a grant in the amount of \$25,000 plus \$2,500 in in kind services.

COMMENTS AND ANALYSIS:

With the cancelling of the Niagara Food Festival for the 2016 season, the grant amount to the Food Festival in the amount of \$24,641.00 is currently unused and still available. The NRE Board of Directors would like to bring a slightly revised event by combining the Niagara Regional Exhibition with a Food Festival to fill this void. They anticipate bringing an invigorating new event in 2017 as part of Canada's 150th birthday.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

The CFO has had an opportunity to review the grant request from the NRE along with their proposed 2016 budget (not approved by the NRE Board) and 2015 Financial Statements and

has determined that the amount of \$24,641.00 which was to be allocated to the Food Festival could be utilized towards the proposed NRE event at the Welland fairgrounds on Niagara Street.

It was also determined that the \$2,500 in in-kind services requested by the NRE would not be granted as this had not been budgeted for, and that the only amount which remains unused, being the \$24,641.00 could be provided to the NRE upon Council approval. The funds will not be paid to the NRE until after the event is completed. In addition we will be requesting the financial statements for the 2016 event to be filed with CFO of the City of Welland.

Since the funding had already been previously allocated and now remains unused, there are no financial implications associated with this request.

OTHER DEPARTMENT IMPLICATIONS:

Corporate and Financial Services and the SEART group would be involved with the transactions and approvals for this event.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION:

The NRE has been a 163 year old tradition in Welland. The NRE Board, after cancelling this year's exhibition, have revisited their decision and are prepared to organize a combined Exhibition – Food Festival for this September. The grant request could be supported by the City by transferring budget approved funds previously earmarked for the Niagara Food Festival.

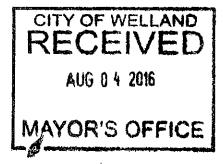

In light of the cancellation of both the Niagara Food Festival and the Fair, our community is feeling a major void. As you have no doubt heard, many residents are concerned and will miss these opportunities to see old friends and enjoy a special time with family.

The Niagara Regional Exhibition (NRE) is prepared to engage a professional event manager and offer a combined Welland Fair and Food Festival in September. However, we would need a permissive grant to make this financially feasible. As has been reported in the local paper, the NRE Board is committed to re-invigorate the Fair for 2017, as part of celebrating Canada's 150th birthday.

We are requesting a permissive grant of \$25,000, plus services in kind from the City up to \$2,500. We understand that \$24,641 allocated for the Food Festival is available in your 2016 budget.

The Niagara Regional Exhibition has never asked for a permissive grant from the city in its 163 year history.

The plan is to incorporate elements of the Food Festival, such as: food vendors, The Apple Pie Contest, The Fire Fighters Chili Cook Off, and Buskers entertaining throughout the fair grounds.

With this grant the Fair could and would run for 3 days, September 16, 17, and 18th, keeping many traditional elements, such as: the Midway, livestock exhibits, Home Show, Demolition Derby, the Fairest Baby Contest, etc. In the past there was an admission charged at the NRE gate, this year it would be free.

NRE board members were encouraged by the Mayor's positive comments in the Tribune. Time is of the essence. If this plan is to go forward, we need a response as soon as possible – hopefully, not later than the week of August 8.
