Understanding homelessness and encampments in Welland

What is homelessness?

Homelessness is a complex issue affecting individuals and families who lack stable, safe, and adequate housing. People may become homeless due to various factors, including economic hardship, mental health challenges, family breakdowns, or unexpected life events.

What are encampments?

Encampments are temporary shelters set up by individuals experiencing homelessness, often in public spaces. These makeshift communities provide a sense of safety and community for those without housing but also present challenges related to safety, health, and public order.



Why do encampments exist?

Together, we can work towards finding solutions and making your community a better place for everyone.
